The Storefront Challenge

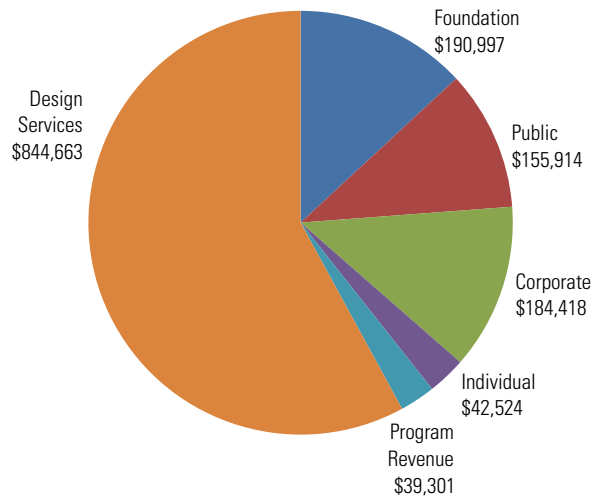
A contest co-hosted with the Philadelphia Department of Commerce to recognize the best storefront facade improvement projects throughout the city, drawing over eighty nominations.



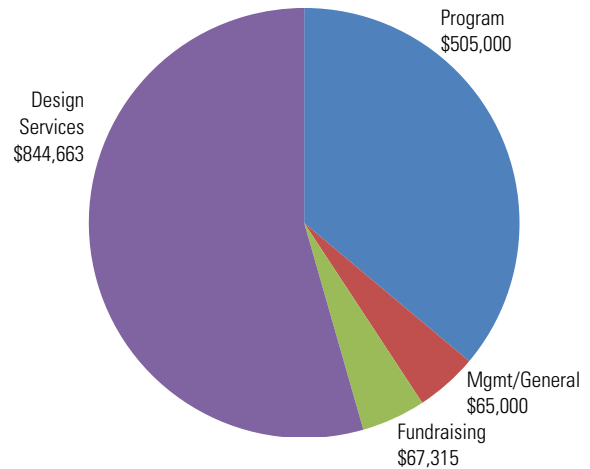
